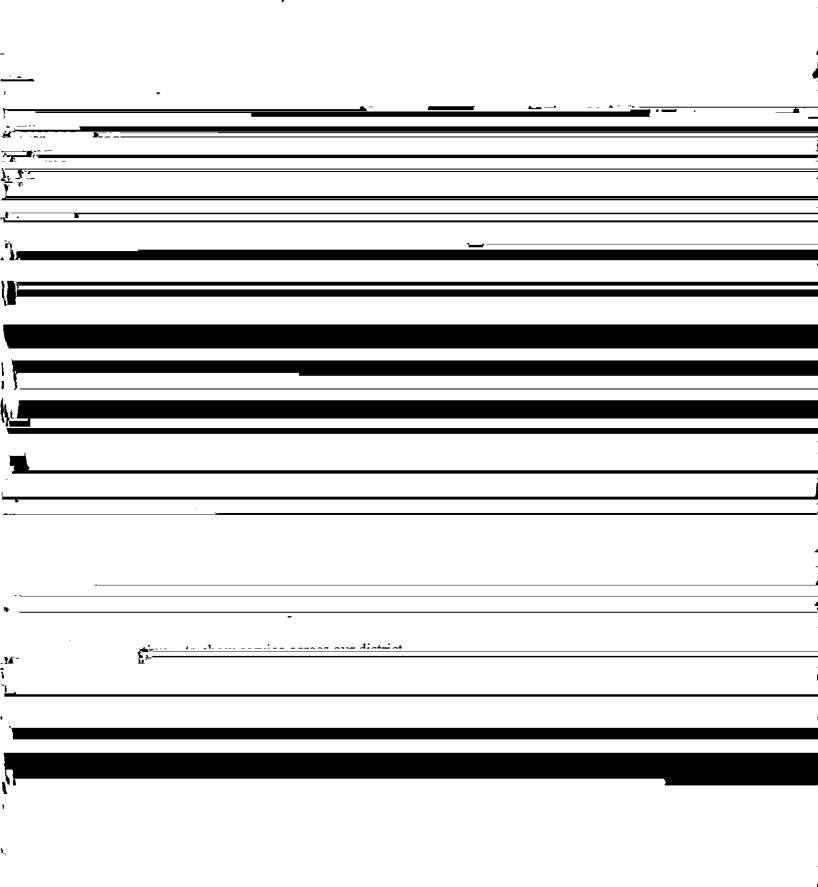
Winter Quarter Enrollment

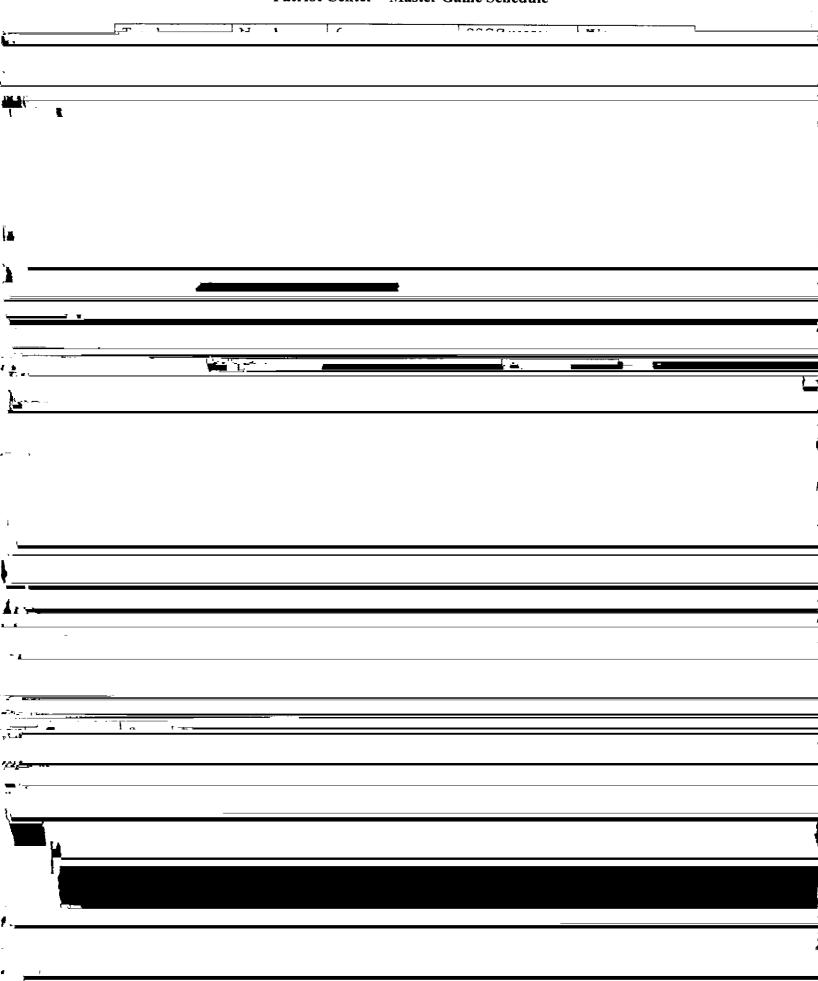


in our district. The good news is that there will be 133 more high school graduates from our district in 2006 than there were in the previous year. The bad news is that in State
